We are working on organising an end of year event for all the IES members. The idea is going to be night time golf at the Bulimba Golf club. Details of this will be announced in future editions of Arcus.

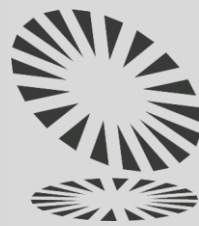

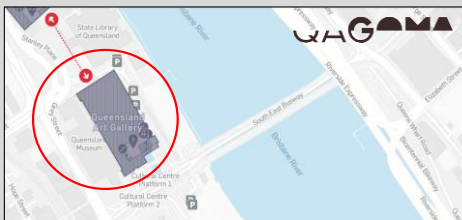
